- Carry out aerial surveys to check dugong numbers across the Torres
 Strait
- Use satellite tracking to understand how turtles and dugong use their habitats.
- Monitor and analyse marine turtle and dugong population trends
- Look at the main threats to turtles and dugongs
- •Compare Torres Strait turtle and dugong populations with international populations

Why this research is important

The project will help the Australian and Queensland governments, TSRA and local communities better manage turtles and dugongs.

- •Improve turtles and dugong management
- •Improve the understanding of Rangers, communities, researchers and decision makers so that we can monitor and manage turtles and dugongs for future generations
- Improve non-indigenous people's awareness of the importance of the traditional and cultural aspects of dugong and turtle management
